Act 10 becomes effective upon the expiration of a bargaining unit's current collective bargaining agreement. Act 10 has also gone into effect at Waukesha County Technical College and Moraine Park Technical College. MPTC has failed to recertify and the WCTC bargaining units have not yet had their recertification elections. All other Wisconsin units maintain contract extensions thru June 2012 or later.
