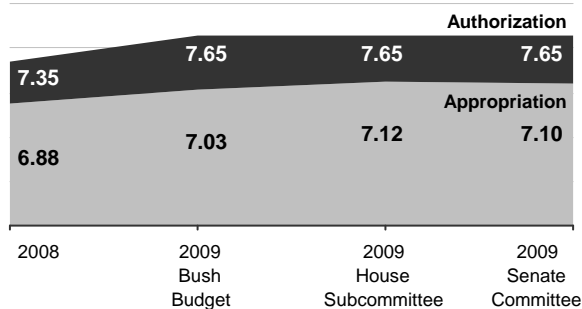

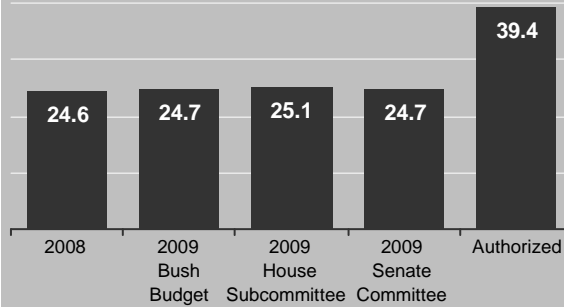
Head Start

(\$ in billions)



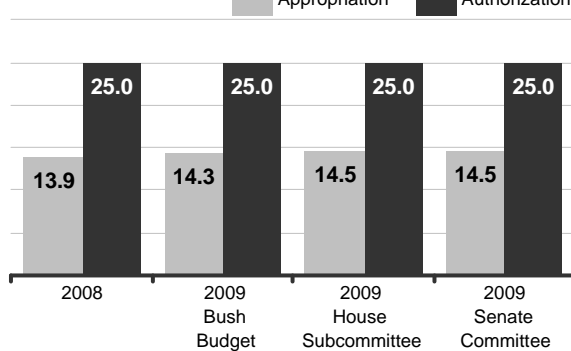
NCLB (No Child Left Behind)

(\$ in billions)



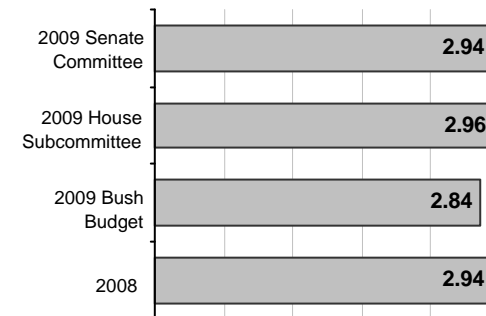
ESEA Title I, Part A Grants to LEAs

(\$ in billions)



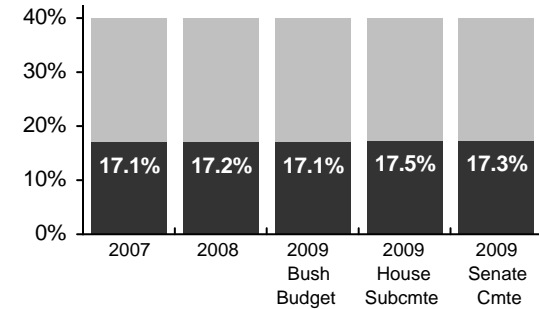
ESEA Title II, Part A Teacher Quality Grants

(\$ in billions)



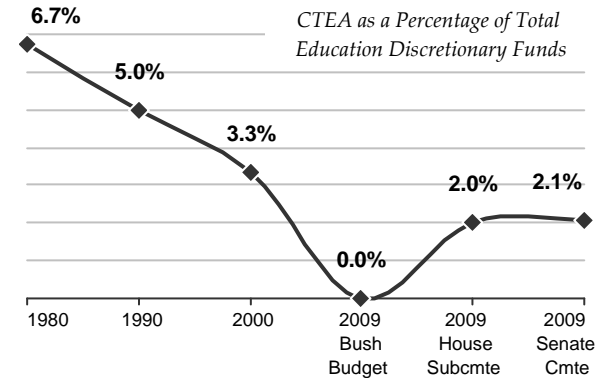
Special Education (IDEA Part B-611)

Funding as a Share of the Federal Promise to Provide 40 Percent of the Excess Costs



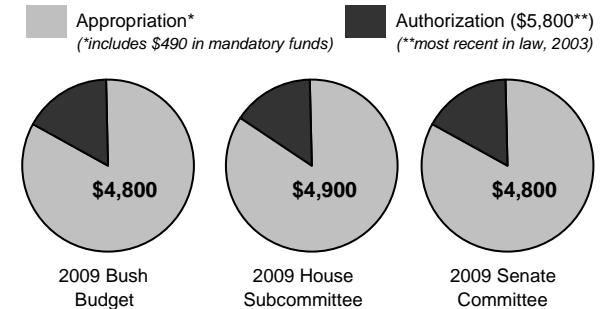
Career & Technical Education (CTEA)
