#### **GRANTS TO LOCAL EDUCATIONAL AGENCIES (ESEA I-A)**

General: includes all four formula grants: Basic (section 1124), Concentration (section 1124A), Targeted (section 1125), and Education Finance Incentive (section 1125A).

Source for 2008: U.S. Department of Education.

Basis for Authorized: represents the amount provided in fiscal year 2007, the last year for which a specific level was provided under the No Child Left Behind Act.

Source for 2009: U.S. Department of Education.

Basis for Underserved: represents the number of children in poverty not served or underserved if the level of funding in 2009 is less than the authorized amount. Underserved was derived

based on a count of total formula children (ages 5 to 17 in families below the poverty level and other special cases as defined in law) as determined by the U.S. Census

Bureau and the Department.

### SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT GRANTS (ESEA section 1003(g))

General:

Source for 2008: U.S. Department of Education.

Basis for Authorized: the authorization amount shown is for fiscal year 2002, the most recent year for which a specific authorization is provided in law; and has been adjusted for inflation.

Source for 2009: U.S. Department of Education.

Basis for Underserved: represents the number of students not served or underserved if the level of funding in 2009 is less than the authorized amount. Underserved was derived based on

estimates of the number of schools identified for improvement, corrective action, and restructuring and related data on Title I schools and students served from the U.S.

Department of Education.

#### IMPACT AID BASIC SUPPORT PAYMENTS (ESEA VIII section 8003(b))

General: represents Basic Support Payments (section 8003(b)) only.

Source for 2008: U.S. Department of Education.

Basis for Authorized: no specific authorization is provided in the No Child Left Behind Act. Alternatively, the NEA used the cost of funding maximum payments as calculated by the

Department.

Source for 2009: U.S. Department of Education.

Basis for Underserved: represents the number of federally connected students not served or underserved if the level of funding in 2009 is less than the cost of funding maximum payments.

Underserved was derived based on the total number of federally connected students as determined by the Department and the National Association of Federally

Impacted Schools.

## **IMPROVING TEACHER QUALITY STATE GRANTS (ESEA II-A)**

General:

Source for 2008: U.S. Department of Education.

Basis for Authorized: the authorization amount shown is for fiscal year 2002, the most recent year for which a specific authorization is provided in law.

Source for 2009: U.S. Department of Education.

Basis for Underserved: represents the number of teachers not hired if the level of funding in 2009 is less than the authorized amount. Teachers not hired was derived using the average

beginning salary nationally from the latest annual survey of state departments of education conducted by the American Federation of Teachers. The estimate assumes

that additional funding to reach the authorized level would have been spent on hiring teachers to reduce class size.

Basis for Authorized: the authorization amount shown is for fiscal year 2002, the most recent year for which a specific authorization is provided in law.

Source for 2009: U.S. Department of Education.

Basis for Underserved: represents the target population, ESEA Title I-A formula children, not served or underserved if the level of funding in 2009 is less than the authorized amount.

Underserved was derived based on a count of total formula children (ages 5 to 17 in families below the poverty level and other special cases as defined in law) as

determined by the U.S. Census Bureau and the Department.

#### 21st CENTURY COMMUNITY LEARNING CENTERS (ESEA IV-B)

Basis for Authorized: represents the amount provided in fiscal year 2007, the last year for which a specific level was provided under the No Child Left Behind Act.

Basis for Underserved: represents the number of students not served or underserved if the level of funding in 2009 is less than the authorized amount. Underserved was derived based on the

Department's estimate of the number of students currently being served.

### **RURAL EDUCATION (ESEA VI-B)**

Source for 2008: U.S. Department of Education.

Basis for Authorized: the authorization amount shown is for fiscal year 2002, the most recent year for which a specific authorization is provided in law.

Source for 2009: U.S. Department of Education.

Basis for Underserved: represents the number of rural students not served or underserved if the level of funding in 2009 is less than the authorized amount. Underserved was derived based on

the Department's number of rural students currently being served under Subpart 1 and a national average cost per rural student calculated by the NEA from Department

budget data for Subpart 2.

Basis for Authorized: the authorization amount shown is for fiscal year 2002, the most recent year for which a specific authorization is provided in law.

Source for 2009: U.S. Department of Education.

Basis for Underserved: represents the number of English language learners (ELLs) not served or underserved if the level of funding in 2009 is less than the authorized amount. Underserved

was derived based on the number of preK-12 ELLs and immigrant students enrolled (source: National Clearinghouse for English Language Acquisition and Language

Instruction Educational Programs).

### SPECIAL EDUCATION GRANTS TO STATES (IDEA Part B-611)

General:

Source for 2008: U.S. Department of Education.

Basis for Authorized: represents the amount authorized in fiscal year 2009 under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Improvement Act of 2004.

Source for 2009: U.S. Department of Education.

Basis for Underserved: represents the number of children with disabilities that are not served or underserved if the level of funding in 2009 is less than the authorized amount. Underserved was

derived based on the Department's estimate of the number of children with disabilities that are currently being served.

### **CAREER & TECHNICAL EDUCATION STATE GRANTS (CTEA Title I)**

Basis for Authorized: no specific authorization is provided in law in fiscal year 2009 under the Carl D. Perkins Career and Technical Education Act of 2006. Alternatively, the NEA used the

cost of restoring career and technical education funding to its peak level funded previously as a share of total education discretionary funding.

Basis for Underserved: represents the number of students not served or underserved if the level of funding in 2009 is less than the amount required to restore career and technical education

funding to its peak level funded previously as a share of total education discretionary funding. Underserved was derived based on the Department's number of students

enrolled in secondary and postsecondary vocational and technical education programs.

### **FEDERAL PELL GRANTS (HEA IV-A-1)**

General: reflects the program's estimated cost as of December 2007, and includes new appropriations plus the use of all or a portion of accumulative surplus of unobligated

balances.

Source for 2009: U.S. Department of Education.

Basis for Underserved: represents the number of eligible recipients not served or underserved if the level of funding in 2009 is less than the amount required to restore the purchasing power of

the average award to its peak level funded previously as a share of the average total cost of attendance at a four-year public institution. Underserved was derived based

on the number of recipients as determined by the Department.

## **HEAD START (HSA section 639)**

General: administered within the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services.

Basis for Authorized: represents the amount authorized in fiscal year 2009 under the Improving Head Start for School Readiness Act of 2007.

enrollment slots as determined by the Department.
