The Opening Plenary will be delivered by Dr. Anthony Jackson, Vice President for Education at Asia Society and founder of Asia Society's International Studies Schools Network (ISSN). The ISSN is the first national network of small, effective, internationally-themed secondary schools. Serving primarily urban, high needs students, these 20 public schools are developing globally competent, college-ready graduates. Research shows the model has higher graduation rates and academic achievement than other schools with similar demographic profiles.
