Alabama	\$345	4,150	<p>The state allocations are estimates based on the state formula used for the State Fiscal Stabilization Fund (SFSF) under the Recovery Act. The number of education jobs funded are estimates based on the same number of jobs that have been reported as funded under the education portion of the SFSF. The number of jobs funded are based on a number of factors, such as the change in state support for education, the portion of the SFSF already committed or expended, the uses for the SFSF, and the size of the state's budget gap, if any. For example, states that are not facing a budget deficit or have not needed to draw down or spend much of their SFSF allocation, are not reporting many jobs funded under the Recovery Act, such as Alaska and Arkansas. Other states, such as Idaho, Kansas, Missouri, and Washington, have already expended all or nearly all of their (phase one) SFSF allocation, and have reported a significant number of jobs funded as a result. In the absence of additional federal aid, such as provided under the Jobs for Main Street Act, these same education jobs could be lost.</p>
