He is most fondly remembered as NEA's "Cat in the Hat." Jack cared about the students, especially those who were financially impacted and needed a helping hand. It is the family's wish that the scholarship go to such a student.

The applicant for the NEA-Retired Jack Kinnaman Memorial Scholarship must meet and submit the following criteria by a postmarked deadline of April 7, 2008:

- List the NEA Student Program activities in which you participate at the local, state and national level;
- Submit a brief paragraph demonstrating your financial need and how this scholarship will help complete their degree in education;
- Submit an essay of up to 200 words describing your NEA Student Program activities on the local, state and/or national level;
- Submit a copy of the most recent transcript with evidence of carrying a 2.5 or better grade point average;
- Complete the application and submit it with two letters of recommendations: one from a faculty member or your NEA Student Program advisor and one from a non-relative. Scholarship application submissions must be a complete package containing all the required information described above.
