

This annual full-time faculty salary report was prepared for NEA by ASA Research prior to the coronavirus pandemic, which closed campuses across the U.S. and destabilized college enrollment and public funding. Until then,

higher education's fiscal environment appeared to be stabilizing, for the first time since the tumultuous years of and subsequent to the Great Recession in 2008. Faculty salaries in 2018-2019 were slightly improved, although large gaps persisted between women's and men's salaries and between the salaries paid to HBCU faculty compared to their colleagues at other land-grant institutions. What's ahead now for faculty salaries, as states and institutions cope with a pandemic-altered landscape, is unclear. But this salary report also shows one important point: full-time faculty at institutions with collectively bargained contracts do much better than their peers without a union.

Ithough state appropriations declined between 2009 and 2012, they have increased annually over the past seven years. In response, the higher education landscape looks quite different than it did before the Great Recession. Students and families, instead of states, now bear a greater burden of the cost of public higher education: from 2006 to 2018, the average inflation-adjusted tuition revenue per student at a public institution increased from \$4,800 to \$6,800, while government appropriations per student declined from \$8,500 to \$7,800. Students and families now contribute about 47 percent of public institutions' revenues, up from 37 percent in 2006.

States are beginning to limit increases in tuition, expand financial aid programs and target funds to support career and technical education programs in an effort to better-align education with labor market needs.⁴

The academic workforce continued to grow and increased by about 7,000 over the past year, or about 1 percent. Faculty purchasing power remained at similar levels since last year but, for some faculty, has not kept pace with inflation over the past 10 years. For some faculty, purchasing power is significantly lower than prerecessionary levels.

This analysis provides an update of the status of academia: trends faculty composition, historical and current perspectives on faculty salaries, and comparisons of faculty salaries across sectors, ranks, states, genders, disciplines, and collective bargaining status

Faculty Composition

In 2018-19, more than 600,000 full-time faculty were employed in the nation's public and independent colleges and universities. As enrollments have increased, so has the number of faculty, which is about 10 percent greater than a decade ago. With this growth, the distribution of faculty — where they teach and the positions they hold — has remained relatively steady over the past several decades.

WHERE DO FACULTY TEACH? The

nation's 609,318 full-time faculty are dispersed across institution types with the largest group — over 4-in-10 — teaching in public research universities (Figure 1). Half as many, 2-in-10, teach in community colleges, while a similar proportion teach in independent research universities. In sum, 7-in-10 faculty teach in public institutions, and more than 8-in-10 faculty are on 9/10-month contracts with the balance working with 11/12-month contracts.

WHAT RANKS DO FACULTY HOLD?

Just over a quarter, 26 percent, of full-time faculty hold full-professor positions (Figure 1). Similar percentages hold associate and assistant professor positions: 23 and

DATA SOURCES

This report relies largely on U.S. Department of Education (ED), National Center for Education Statistics (NCES), Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS) Human Resources data. Reflecting 2018-19, NCES collected data from 4,014 degree-granting colleges and universities as part of the annual IPEDS data collection for higher education institutions.

This analysis excluded 989 seminaries, religious training institutions, and for-profit colleges, leaving 3,025 institutions. At the time of analysis, these data are the provisional release of the IPEDS data and results may differ from data reported by NCES in the future.

This report also makes use of data provided by the College and University Professional Association (CUPA) reflecting 2018-19 average salaries in 340 public four- and two-year institutions, by academic specialty; this report reflects 111,142 tenured or tenure-track faculty members.

22 percent, respectively. Instructors comprise 14 percent of faculty, while lecturers and faculty with no rank make up the remaining 15 percent.





FIGURE 2: TENURE IS MOST FREQUENT IN PUBLIC COMPREHENSIVE INSTITUTIONS

TENURE AND CONTRACT TYPE. A

larger share of faculty in public institutions have tenure or are on-track than (63 percent) those teaching in independent institutions (58 percent; Figure 2). Within the public sector, faculty in comprehensive institutions are the most likely to have tenure or be on-track for tenure, (77 percent); notably, this is a relatively small sector comprising only about 35,000, or 6 percent of full-time faculty. A smaller share of faculty in community colleges have tenure or are on-track (55 percent) compared with those in public research institutions (65 percent).

Institutions provide a variety of contracts to faculty without tenure or not on-track. The majority of community college faculty, 75 percent, are on annual contracts and only 15 percent hold multi-year or indefinite contracts (Figure 3). Meanwhile, faculty in other public institutions are more likely to hold multi-year contracts (34 percent) or indefinite contracts (47 percent.)


Faculty Salaries

THE RECESSIONARY EFFECT.

Purchasing power is the salary paid in a given year corrected for inflation. It represents the ability — or power — to purchase goods and services. Over time, fluctuations in faculty purchasing power mirror the country's economy. During inflationary periods and recessions, purchasing power typically declines. Likewise, it generally improves during periods of economic

recovery or growth, such as the 1990s tech boom.

Figure 4 displays faculty purchasing power in 2008-09, prior to the start of the Great Recession, compared to 2018-19 purchasing power. On average, faculty felt slightly "richer" in 2018-19 compared with 2008-09 as purchasing power improved over the decade by \$1,367, or 2 percent. However, within faculty ranks, the change was negative in some cases. For example, full professors experienced a 2 percent decline in purchasing power over the decade, almost \$2,000, while instructors experienced the largest loss in purchasing power, an 11 percent decline, from an average purchasing power of about \$68,000 in 2008-09 to about \$60,000 in 2018-19.

salaries in 2018-19. The \$88,719 average salary for faculty on 9/10-month contracts in 2018-19 represents a 2 percent increase over 2017-18 (Figure 4) (not adjusted for inflation). Salary differentials exist across institutional sectors, ranks, genders, disciplines, and states. For example, faculty teaching in independent institutions were paid, on average, over \$12,000 more than colleagues in public institutions, a 14 percent differential (\$85,114 and \$97,224, respectively; Figure 5).


SALARIES BY ACADEMIC RANK AND

SECTOR. Academic rank correlates positively with higher salaries (Figure 5). Associate and assistant professors earn about three-quarters and two-thirds of the salaries of full professors; full professors teaching in public institutions averaged \$112,214 in 2018-19, associates and assistants earned \$83,623 and \$73,132, respectively.



FIGURE 4: SOME FACULTY FARE BETTER OVER TIME


Average Purchasing Power of Full-Time Faculty on 9/10-Month Contracts: 2008-09 and 2018-19

Instructors, lecturers, and faculty with no rank in public institutions earned slightly more than one-half of the average salaries of full professors, ranging from \$59,000 to \$61,000.

Within the faculty ranks, independent institutions' average salaries were higher than those at public institutions, with the differential ranging from \$261 for lecturers to over \$24,000 for full professors. However, by sector, faculty teaching in community colleges earn, on average, higher salaries compared with colleagues in the independent sector.


FIGURE 6: THE GENDER GAP IS SMALLEST AT PUBLIC TWO-YEAR INSTITUTIONS; LARGEST FOR PROFESSORS IN RESEARCH UNIVERSITIES.

SALARIES BY GENDER. Among workers in all industries, female, fulltime workers earn about 82 cents to a dollar of men's earnings.5 The same is true, overall, in academia, with women faculty averaging 84 percent of men's earnings at public institutions, and 81 percent at independent institutions in 2018-19. However, when comparing men's and women's salaries by sector and rank, the magnitude of the salary disparity is often reduced: Depending on rank, women earned 97 to 99 percent of men's earnings in community colleges (Figure 6). However, the disparity between men's and women's salaries is much larger in the better well-paid faculty positions: Women earned only 81 percent overall, and 88 percent of men professor's earnings at

The overall pay disparity is due, in part, to the fact that more women work in lower-paying sectors and ranks than men. In 2018-19, women comprised almost one-half of the professoriate (47 percent in public and 45 percent in independent institutions). Yet, women represented only 31 percent of all full

public research universities.

professors at public research/doctoral-granting institutions (Figure 7).

SALARIES BY STATE. Due to differences in local and regional economies, cost of living, state budgets, union representation, demographics, and student and labor force demands, faculty salaries and changes in salaries vary widely by state and sector. And, although the ranking of salaries by state across sectors (e.g., public 2-year compared with public 4-year) are not always similar, state rankings within sector remain relatively stable over time.

Among public four-year institutions, California, New Jersey, and Delaware have held the top ranks for a number of years, with Hawaii, Michigan and Connecticut following closely. California faculty salaries increased about 4 percent over the last year to \$114,755 in 2018-19, which lands them at the top of the ranking for 4-year institutions. Last year's number one, New Jersey, saw a small, less-than-one percent increase and an average salary of \$113,212 (Table 1). Delaware came in a close third with an average salary of

\$112,746. Two other states—Hawaii and Michigan—paid public four-year faculty over \$100,000, on average. Connecticut, where last years' public 4-year average salaries were over \$100,00, experienced a small declineabout 1 percent-and the average salary was just under \$100,000 in 2018-19. This decline likely does not represent a decline in salaries paid to individuals, it is more likely due to a shift of faculty across ranks, e.g., an influx of younger faculty taking over for retiring, full professors. States that are perennially among the lowest ranking for public four-year institutions-Mississippi, Arkansas, Louisiana, West Virginia and South Dakota—all have average faculty salaries over \$70,000 for the first time. And, some of the lower ranked states saw relatively large increases, outpacing inflation. For example, West Virginia had a 5 percent increase, and Idaho, 3 percent.

State rankings among public two-year institutions also are consistent. California community colleges, as they have for many years, topped the public two-year chart with an average salary of \$97,171, which, notably, represents a relatively large, 4 percent increase over last year. Ranked number two, Michigan's average 2-year salary is about \$13,000 less, or \$83,708. Wisconsin, New York and Illinois are close behind with salaries ranging about \$79,000 to \$82,000. Louisiana and Arkansas placed at the bottom of the ranking for public two-year institutions, as they have historically, with average salaries of \$45,262 and \$47,191. For the second year, Arizona experienced large increases (11.1 percent) in salaries, improving its

public two-year average salary ranking from 17th to 9th.

The range in average salary across states was \$51,909 in public two-years and \$44,639 in public four-years in 2018-19; these differences have grown over time. 6 Not surprisingly, for the most part, states are ranked similarly in

both sectors: example, Texas is ranked 24th in salary at two-year and four-year institutions.

On average, faculty earned \$20,679 more at public four-year institutions than at two-year colleges. By state, the differences vary widely from \$11,003 in Illinois to \$41,992 in Delaware. The

exception is Wisconsin where public four-year faculty earned \$818 less than faculty teaching in public two-year colleges.


Among independent institutions, with an average faculty salary of \$122,715 and a 2.8 percent increase over 2017-18, Massachusetts regained its perennial number-one rank. Independent institutions paid higher average salaries than public four-year institutions in 19 states, with faculty teaching at independent institutions in the District of Columbia having the largest advantage over colleagues at the University of the District of Columbia (\$117,945 and \$76,695, respectively, or a \$41,250 difference). Delaware faculty at public four-years had the largest advantage over those at independent institutions (\$112,746 compared with \$73,575, a \$39,171 difference).

SALARY BY DISCIPLINE. Salaries paid to faculty vary widely depending on the discipline taught. Historically, faculty teaching in legal professions, business, engineering and computer science fields rank at the top, while those teaching arts and library science tend near the bottom. This trend held in 2018-19 with faculty teaching at public institutions in legal professions, business, and engineering fields topping the charts with salaries averaging over \$100,000, while those traditionally at the bottom were paid around \$72,000 (Table 2).7 Communications technologies is new to the bottom of the list this year with an average salary of \$70,626; however, also new to this data report is the inclusion of public 2-year institutions' data (in prior years, this report included exclusively public 4-year institutions).

THE HBCU DISADVANTAGE. Land grant institutions are funded under the federal Morrill Act. The 1862 Act provided land and funding to institutions to provide career-type training in fields such as agriculture, science, military science, and engineering. Sixty institutions are funded under the 1862 Morrill Act; these are typically states' large research and flagship institutions. Subsequently, the 1890 Morrill Act established historically black colleges and universities (HBCUs): today, 19 HBCUS, primarily in the southeastern states, have land-grant designation.

HBCUs depend more on governmental funding compared with the large, research university land grant institutions: 30 percent of HBCU's funding is from appropriations compared with 17 percent of the 1862 Morrill Act land grant institutions. The Morrill Act requires institutions and states to match the earmarked federal dollars in order to receive the federally appropriated amount. While states are


required to match 100 percent of the 1862 land grant appropriations, the same is not true for HBCUs. If 100 percent of the HBCU match is not made, the HBCU is in danger of losing a portion of the federal allocation in addition to the loss of the non-matched funds. This funding framework has resulted in HBCUs losing revenue streams of over \$10 million in a given year.8

HBCUs generally have more limited financial resources than the 1862 land grants, and their funding is more tenuous, affecting the institutional budgeting process. About 82,000 fulltime faculty teach in 1862 land grant institutions, while 4,300 teach in HBCUs with land grant designation. The 2018-19 average salary for the 1862 land grant institutions was \$105,535, compared with \$66,831 for faculty in the 1890 HBCU land-grant institutions. As noted above, overall faculty purchasing power is higher today than the pre-recessionary period, 2008-09. Yet, as shown in Figure 8,

while faculty purchasing power increased for faculty teaching in 1862 land grant institutions by 4 percent, or more than \$4,200, those teaching in HBCU land grants felt a decline in purchasing power of nearly \$4,000, or 5 percent. These changes resulted in an \$8,000 growth in the wage gap between faculty teaching at 1862 and 1890 land grant institutions, for a \$38,702 difference in the average salary in 2018-19.


HBCUs do not operate in all states or regions; most are in the south and southeastern states where the cost of living and salaries are generally lower than in other areas of the country. However, even when comparing average salaries in the 16 states that house HBCUs, faculty salaries are significantly lower at HBCUs than at the 1862 land grants in the same states—on average, \$31,936 lower (Figure 9). Faculty in Kentucky experience the largest difference, \$43,722 and Mississippi the smallest, \$14,063.

Graduate Employees

Graduate assistants (GAs) or graduate employees receive compensation, generally, in two forms—stipends and tuition and fees waivers, both of which can range widely in value. In 2018-19, the average GA stipend was \$17,947. Including tuition and fees waivers, average total compensation was \$25,656 (Figure 10). Across the graduate employee types teaching assistant, research assistant, and graduate associate — the average stipend ranged by \$4,419, while the average stipend plus tuition waiver amount ranged by \$3,584. However, by discipline, the total compensation amount ranged from an average low of \$20,100 in architecture to an average high of \$34,263 in health residency programs, a difference of \$14,163 (Table 3). Large ranges also exist within discipline, for example, five disciplines had minimum compensation amounts below \$1,000, but high compensation amounts over \$50,000. Biology and life science had the largest difference between the high and low compensation, nearly \$100,000, followed by business with about a \$90,000 difference.

Salary by Collective Bargaining Status

Figure 11 displays average faculty salaries (in thousands of dollars) for public institutions (1) with faculty collective bargaining agreements, (2) in the same states as the former, but without faculty collective bargaining agreements, and (3) in states where there is no presence of faculty collective bargaining agreements. States without presence of collective bargaining are largely southern states and, given their economies, tend to have lower salaries than institutions in other areas of the country. Thus, the

first two groups are most comparable as regional effects are minimized.

In states where some public institutions have faculty contracts, faculty at those public institutions with contracts had an average salary advantage of about \$6,000 over faculty teaching in institutions in the same state without faculty contracts. The advantage for faculty at institutions with contracts over those teaching in states without the presence of faculty contracts was \$14,000 last year; as noted, regional economies and cost of living differences may contribute to this difference. In states with faculty contracts, faculty teaching in community colleges enjoy a large salary advantage when a faculty contract is present and earned about \$18,000, or 30 percent, more than faculty in the same states without contracts. Faculty teaching with contracts in comprehensive institutions also enjoyed a large salary advantage

over their non-bargaining colleagues, about \$15,000, and salaries averaging about 22 percent more. Faculty in doctoral-granting institutions with contracts also had a salary advantage, although the difference is not quite as large — \$7,000 dollars, or about 8 percent.

Conclusion

Faculty salaries fluctuate over time. Although faculty purchasing power, on average, is higher than prerecessionary levels, some faculty, depending on rank or institution type, are not feeling as financially strong as they did in pre-recessionary times. Some states have felt the brunt of tightening finances. As public funding has declined, so have average faculty salaries - with such magnitude that their ranking across states fell as well. And historically, women continue to work in l ower-paying sectors and do not hold the high-paying full-professor positions with as much frequency as men; thus, women's salaries, on average, are lower. At HBCUs, purchasing power of faculty declined over the past decade, even as the purchasing power of their colleagues teaching in the 1862 land-grant institutions increased, causing a widening of the pay gap. Meanwhile, as graduate employees take on more and more teaching and research responsibilities, the large differences seen in their pay and tuition waivers make it apparent that compensation standards for graduate students likely do not exist.

The data also shows that faculty teaching in institutions with collective bargaining agreements have higher average salaries than those teaching in institutions without agreements. Thus, it follows that, particularly among faculty groups where salaries lag or gaps are increasing — including part-time or contingent faculty, who are not addressed in these pages due to lack of data availability —union representation likely could address compensation and workplace conditions.
