EDUCATION STABILIZATION FUND

The Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2021, includes \$81.88 billion for an Education Stabilization Fund, to remain available through September 30, 2022, to prevent, prepare for, and respond to coronavirus. After set asides for the outlying areas and Bureau of Indian Education of 0.5%, of the remaining funds, 5% is reserved for the Governor's Emergency Education Relief Fund (\$4.05 billion), 67% is reserved for the Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund (\$54.3 billion), and 28% is reserved for the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (\$22.7 billion). Of the amount reserved for awards to Governors, \$2.75 billion is set aside to provide emergency assistance to non-public schools. Otherwise, awards to Governors may be used to provide emergency support through grants to local educational agencies (LEAs) and institutions of higher education (IHEs) that have been most significantly impacted by coronavirus. Under the emergency fund for elementary and secondary schools, not less than 90% must be used for subgrants to LEAs in proportion to the funds LEAs received under Title I, Part A. Remaining funds will be used for emergency needs as determined by the State educational agency. Of the funds for higher education, 89% must be distributed to IHEs to prevent, prepare for, and respond to coronavirus (\$20.2 billion); 7.5% is reserved for Historically Black Colleges and Universities and other minority-serving institutions (\$1.7 billion); 0.5% for IHEs having the greatest unmet needs related to coronavirus as determined by the Secretary (\$113.5 million); and 3% for financial aid for students at for-profit IHEs (\$680.9 million).
