**GEER**

Allocations to Nebraska

*Both the CARES Act and CRRSA Act provided funding to Governors through the Governor’s Emergency Education Relief (GEER) Fund. The U.S. Department of Education is required to allocate 60 percent of the funds based on each state’s relative population of individuals aged 5 through 24, and 40 percent based on each state’s relative number of children counted under the Title I, Part A formula.*

GEER funds may be used by the Governor of Nebraska in support of public elementary and secondary education, institutions of higher education (IHEs), or other education-related entities. A Governor has wide discretion in determining the entities in the State that will receive GEER funds. A Governor can choose to fund only LEAs, only IHEs, only education-related entities, or any combination of eligible entities.

## LEA ALLOCATIONS

Under the CARES Act programs, the United States Department of Education (USED) will make awards to State educational agencies (SEAs) to help States to prevent, prepare for, and respond to the devastating effects of the Novel Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19).

### Methodology for Calculating Allocations

Section 18003(b) of the CARES Act requires the USED to allocate the Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund (ESSER Fund) based on the proportion that each state received under Title I, Part A in the most recent fiscal year. To determine the ESSER Fund allocations, the USED used the federal fiscal year (FFY) 2019 state shares of Title I, Part A allocations without the application of the hold harmless provisions in ESEA Section 1122.

The Nebraska Department of Education (Department) will allocate no less than 90 percent of the grant funds under this program to LEAs in the State. Under the ESSER Fund, the USED will award grants by formula to SEAs for the purpose of providing LEAs with emergency relief funds to address the impact of COVID-19 has had, and continues to have, on elementary and secondary schools across the Nation. This includes both continuing to provide educational services, such as remote learning, while schools and campuses are closed, and developing and implementing plans for the return to normal operations.<sup>1</sup>

### LEA Eligibility

The Department will allocate these funds to LEAs based on their respective shares of funds received under title I, Part A of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 in FFY 2019. An LEA that did not receive Title I, Part A funds in school fiscal year 2019-20 (either because it was not eligible or because it declined funding) would not generate a share of ESSER Funds.

### Department Uses of Funds

The Department will use the remaining funds for emergency needs as determined by the Department to address issues related to COVID-19, which may be addressed through the use of grants or contracts. From this reserve, the Department may use not more than 1/2 of 1 percent of the SEA total grant for administrative costs.

Under the CARES Act, the Department was appropriated \$65,085,085, of which a minimum LEA distribution of \$58,576,577 is required to flow through to LEAs as subgrants. The Department can retain no more than \$6,508,509 for state-level activities related to COVID-19, which includes \$325,425 for administration.<sup>2</sup>

### Non-Public Equitable Services

An LEA receiving ESSER funds will provide equitable services to students and teachers in non-public schools within the LEA as required under 18005 of Division B of the CARES Act and in the same manner as provided under section 1117 of the ESEA, as determined through timely and meaningful consultation with representatives of non-public schools.

Per USDE guidance, an LEA must maintain and provide a copy of the [CARES Act Funding Nonpublic Consultation Form](#) to the Nebraska Department of Education for every non-public school within boundaries eligible to receive an equitable share of CARES Act funding. **NOTE:** A signed copy of the form for every non-public school eligible to receive equitable services within an LEA's boundaries will be required to be uploaded as an attachment to the LEA's CARES Act ESSER Fund sub-grant application in the Grants Management System (GMS).

**Estimated Non-Public Equitable Services Calculation & USED Guidance**

For ESSER funds, the non-public school share of the allocation to an LEA is determined by dividing the total enrollment of the non-public schools by the total combined enrollment of public and non-public schools within the LEA’s boundaries. This methodology as well as providing equitable services under the CARES Act is contained in USED [guidance on equitable services](#) published on April 30, 2020.

The USED’s guidance calculates equitable services to non-public school students and teachers based on the ratio of all students enrolled in public and non-public sectors, rather than the proportion of eligible students in poverty in each sector as indicated in the CARES Act. Given this discrepancy between statutory language and guidance, until and if Congress or the federal courts require that the U.S. Department of Education change its present guidance, Nebraska will follow that guidance, in order to ensure that critically needed federal funds are not jeopardized through noncompliance.

It is not clear if or how the U.S. Department of Education may clarify its guidance or attempt to require LEAs to allocate funds to follow the plain language of the law—that “equitable services” to non-public schools be provided in the “same manner” as Title I rather than the manner articulated in guidance. Given this uncertainty, LEAs might want to plan for the need for additional funds to be allocated for equitable services.

\*The non-public proportionate share of equitable services under ESSER are based on 2019-2020 Fall Membership for public schools and the non-public schools (within boundaries) along with the proportionate share of the LEA’s total allocation under ESSER. Non-public share of the ESSER Fund represents 100 percent of nonpublic school participation in equitable services provided through the CARES Act funding.

# Nebraska Department of Education Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund (ESSER II)

Authorized by the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2021

## LOCAL EDUCATIONAL AGENCY (LEA) ALLOCATIONS

Under the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations (CRRSA) Act, 2021, the United States Department of Education (USED) will make awards to State educational agencies (SEAs) to help States to prevent, prepare for, and respond to the devastating effects of the Novel Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19).

Section 311(b) of the CRRSA Act requires the USED, after reserving 1 percent of the \$81.88 billion appropriated for the Education Stabilization Fund for the Outlying Areas (1/2 of 1 percent) and the Bureau of Indian Education at the Department of the Interior (1/2 of 1 percent), to reserve 67 percent of remaining funds, or \$54,311,004,000, for the Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund (ESSER II Fund) authorized under section 313 of the CRRSA Act.

### Methodology for Calculating Allocations

Section 313(b) of the CRRSA Act requires the USED to allocate the ESSER II Fund based on the proportion that each State received under Title I, Part A of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 (ESEA) in the most recent fiscal year. However, section 1122(c)(3) of the ESEA prohibits the Department from considering the Title I, Part A hold harmless provisions in ESEA section 1122 in calculating State or local allocations for any other program administered by the Secretary, including the ESSER II Fund. Therefore, to determine the ESSER II Fund allocations, the Department used the federal fiscal year (FFY) 2020 State shares of Title I, Part A allocations without the application of the hold harmless provisions in ESEA section 1122.

The Nebraska Department of Education (Department) will allocate no less than 90 percent of the State's grant funds under this program to Nebraska LEAs. Under the ESSER II Fund, the USED will award grants by formula to SEAs for the purpose of providing LEAs with emergency relief funds to address the impact of COVID-19 has had, and continues to have, on elementary and secondary schools across the Nation. The use of the funds under this program is broad, flexible, and consistent with the USED's goal that LEAs will use every effort to spend funds quickly to address exigent student needs.

### LEA Eligibility

The Department will allocate these funds to LEAs based on their respective shares of funds received under Title I, Part A of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 in FFY 2020. An LEA that did not receive Title I, Part A funds in school fiscal year 2020-21 (either because the district was not eligible or because it declined funding) would not generate a share of ESSER II Funds. LEAs are not required to provide equitable services under the ESSER II Fund.

### Department Uses of Funds

The Department will use the remaining funds for emergency needs as determined by the Department to address issues related to COVID-19, which may be addressed through subgrants or contracts. From this reserve, the Department may use not more than 1/2 of 1 percent for administrative costs.

Under the CRRSA Act, the Department was appropriated [\\$243,073,530](#), of which a minimum LEA distribution of \$218,766,177 is required to flow through to LEAs as subgrants. The Department can retain no more than \$24,307,353 for state-level activities related to COVID-19, which includes \$1,215,368 for administration.

**LOCAL EDUCATIONAL AGENCY (LEA) ALLOCATIONS**

Under the American Rescue Plan (ARP) Act of 2021, the United States Department of Education (USED) will make awards to State educational agencies (SEAs) to help schools safely reopen, sustain healthy operations, and address significant academic, social, emotional, and mental health needs of their students as the country continues to recover from the COVID-19 pandemic.

Section 2001 of the ARP requires the USED to allocate \$121,974,800,000 in awards to SEAs through the Elementary and Secondary Emergency Relief (ESSER) Fund.

**Methodology for Calculating Allocations**

Section 2001(c) of the ARP requires the USED to determine ARP ESSER Fund allocations based on the proportion that each State received under Title I, Part A of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) in the most recent fiscal year. However, section 1122(c)(3) of the ESEA prohibits the USED from considering the Title I, Part A hold harmless provisions in ESEA section 1122 in calculating State or local allocations for any other program administered by the Secretary, including the ARP ESSER Fund. Therefore, to determine the ARP ESSER Fund allocations, the USED utilized the federal fiscal year (FFY) 2020 State shares of Title I, Part A allocations without the application of the hold harmless provisions in ESEA section 1122.

The Nebraska Department of Education (NDE) will allocate no less than 90 percent of the State's grant funds under this program to Nebraska Local Education Agencies (LEAs). Under the ARP ESSER Fund, the USED will award grants by formula to SEAs for the purpose of providing LEAs with emergency relief funds to address the impact of COVID-19 has had, and continues to have, on elementary and secondary schools across the Nation. The use of the funds under this program is broad, flexible, and consistent with the USED's goal that LEAs make every effort to spend funds quickly to address exigent student needs.

**LEA Eligibility**

The NDE will allocate these funds to LEAs based on their respective shares of funds received under Title I, Part A of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 in FFY 2020. An LEA that did not receive Title I, Part A funds in school fiscal year 2020-21 (either because the district was not eligible or because it declined funding) would not generate a share of ARP ESSER Funds. LEAs are not required to provide equitable services, however, will be required to reserve at least 20% of the funds to address 'learning loss' through evidence-based interventions under the ARP ESSER Fund.

**Department Uses of Funds**

The NDE will use 5% for 'learning loss', 1% for summer enrichment programs, 1% for afterschool programs, and the remaining funds for emergency needs as determined by the NDE to respond to COVID-19, which may be addressed through subgrants or contracts. From this reserve, the NDE may use not more than 1/2 of 1 percent for administrative costs.

Under the ARP Act, the NDE was appropriated \$545,908,619, of which a minimum LEA distribution of \$491,317,757 is required to flow through to LEAs as subgrants. The Department can retain no more than \$54,590,862 for state-level activities related to COVID-19, which includes \$2,729,543 for administration.
