



## NEA Education Support Professional Earnings Report

### April 2024

#### Key Findings

- There are over 3.0 million education support professionals (ESPs) working in public education, 75 percent of whom work in K–12 schools, and 25 percent of whom work at higher education institutions. (Table 1)
- In K–12 schools, the most common career family for ESPs is paraeducator (40.8 percent), followed by clerical (16.1 percent) and custodial (15.2 percent). For higher education, clerical positions are the most common (38.0 percent), followed by paraeducators, including graduate assistants (20.1 percent), and technical services (15.0 percent). (Tables 2b and 2c)
- More than three-quarters of all ESPs (76.4 percent) work full time, which is defined as 30 or more hours per week. This is slightly higher for those working at K–12 schools (79.8 percent) and slightly lower in higher education (66.2 percent). (Tables 3a, 3b and 3)
- Among ESPs working full-time, the average earnings in 2022-23 was \$35,995. This average was slightly lower for K–12 (\$33,756) and higher in higher education (\$44,898). (Table 4)
  - Delaware had the highest average K–12 ESP full-time earnings at \$44,237. The average K–12 ESP full-time earnings was above \$40,000 in only five states (Delaware, District of Columbia, Alaska, New Jersey, and Connecticut).
  - Oklahoma had the lowest average K–12 ESP full-time earnings at \$26,612. The average K–12 ESP full-time earnings was below \$28,000 in six states (Oklahoma, Idaho, Mississippi, Kansas, Kentucky, and Tennessee).
  - New Jersey had the highest average full-time earnings for ESPs working in higher education at \$53,200. The average full-time earnings for ESPs working in higher education was above \$50,000 in only three states (New Jersey, Connecticut, and California).
  - Mississippi had the lowest average full-time earnings for ESPs working in higher education at \$34,898. The average full-time earnings for ESPs working in higher education was below \$38,000 in nine states (Mississippi, Idaho, South Dakota, Arkansas, New Mexico, Maine, Oklahoma, Kentucky, Vermont, and Tennessee).
- A third (32.7 percent) of all ESPs working full-time earn less than \$25,000 per year, and 11.2 percent earn less than \$15,000. Among those working in K–12 schools, 38.0 percent earn less than \$25,000, and 12.5 percent earn less than \$15,000. Within higher education, 14.0 percent earn less than \$25,000, and 6.4 percent earn less than \$15,000. (Tables 5a, 5b, and 5c)
- The average earnings for ESP rose from \$31,223 in 2013-14 to \$35,995 in 2022-23. However, when adjusted for inflation, the average earnings for ESP fell from \$31,223 to \$28,149 in constant 2014 dollars. (Figure 1)

- In states where there are bargaining laws covering ESPs, the average earnings is \$38,167. In states that do not have a bargaining law but where bargaining may take place, the average ESP earnings is \$33,831. In states where bargaining is prohibited, the average ESP earnings is \$32,308. (Figure 2)
- In a recent NEA survey of its members, nearly a third (32 percent) of PK-12 ESPs said they were having a serious issue making a living wage, and another 21 percent said this was a moderate problem for them. More than a quarter of PK-12 ESP reported participating in or utilizing assistance programs, with seven percent utilizing free grocery or free meal programs, 7 percent participating in Medicaid, and 4 percent using SNAP benefits.
- In the same NEA member survey, about three-quarters of PK-12 ESP (77 percent) reported not working a full 12-month contract. Just under a quarter of this group (21 percent) reported being laid off at the end of the school year, with only 8 percent stating that they are eligible for unemployment benefits during the time that they are laid off.

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## About this Report

This report provides earnings data for education support professionals (ESPs) working in K–12 schools and higher education institutions. The data are from the U.S. Census Bureau’s American Community Survey (ACS), a large, continuously collected survey that uses a nationwide sample. As a result, the data presented here provide a picture of ESPs working in public schools as a whole rather than NEA’s ESP membership. Earnings averages are calculated using five years of ACS data (2017-2021), while other tables use three years of data (2019-21). Earnings data are adjusted to 2022 dollars and are termed 2022–2023 to reflect the academic calendar.


