





Want to make a difference for public school employees now and after retirement?

Become a pre-retired lifetime member!

An actively employed professional or education support professional (ESP) member who is eligible for a New Jersey state pension may join NJREA prior to retirement at the current lifetime dues rate. Becoming a lifetime member will lock-in your savings!

If you elect to join NJREA prior to retirement as a lifetime member, you may pay the dues in 10 monthly installments (Sept. thru June) during one school year. NJEA will bill you monthly; dues may not be deducted from your salary.

NOTE: No money will be refunded should any pre-retiree member leave the profession. For more details about this opportunity and payment installment options, please contact the NJEA Membership Division at 609-310-4546, press #9.

HONORING RETIREES & FUTURE INITIATIVES

Importance of recognizing retirees and honoring their contributions.

Encourage active locals to:

Submit retiree names for recognition (folio sample).

Use contact information for recruitment campaign
 over summer into fall (phone calls, email blasts & Hustle)
 Cover the first year of REA membership for retirees.

The **25-Year Club Initiative** as a bridge connecting active members to REA.

Attendance at Affiliate Conferences and attend President Trainings and Membership workshops to strengthen recruitment efforts.

These help build a stronger, more engaged REA membership!





YOU DON'T HAVE TO SPEND A LOT OF MONEY!

Creative Ideas for Implementing Initiatives Without Funding (5 minutes)

- Leverage Volunteer Efforts
 - Encourage members to volunteer time and skills for events and outreach.
- Utilize Free Digital Tools
 - Create a Facebook page
- Partner with Local Businesses
 - Seek in-kind donations or sponsorships in exchange for promotion at events

- Host Potluck Events
 - Plan a picnic where everyone brings a dish to share
- Create DIY Marketing Materials
 - Design flyers using free templates and distribute at local events

Annual Membership Outreach – Keeping Retirees Connected

September: Membership cards & officer welcome letter. October: Gifting letter—upgrade to lifetime membership.(still doing this)

November: Renewal reminder for annual members & new retirees.

March: Email to local presidents about gifting opportunity. May: Renewal letters for the upcoming year.



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CLOSING REMARKS
