
- Member Advocacy Made the Difference! Active and Retired Members made calls, sent emails, held rallies, and made Hill and in-district visits.
- We worked with allies across the Labor Movement.
- Social Security Fairness Act signed into law on January 5.
- Retroactive Payments started February 25 dating back to January 2024. Most people will see their benefits change in April 2025 (for their March benefit)

- At this stage of a Presidency, the only President less popular than Trump is now was.....Trump last time.
- ➤ The other trend that this chart shows is the increase in partisan perspective polarization since the 90s.

- > Trump agenda even less popular than Trump.
