Potential 'Reconciliation' Bill Threatens Public Education



The details of the GOP majority's reconciliation bill remain in flux, but the big picture is clear: massive tax giveaways for billionaires, paid for by everyone else. Support for vulnerable students would wither while a voucher-inspired scheme diverts taxpayer dollars from public to private and religious schools. Here's just some of what is planned.

VOUCHERS

- Tax credit voucher scheme modeled after the Educational Choice for Children Act (S. 292/H.R. 817)
- Dollar-for-dollar reductions in federal taxes for "charitable" contributions ultimately used to pay tuition at private and religious schools
- To cover the cost—\$100 billion over 10 years—proponents are working to slash public school funding

HIGHER EDUCATION

- Hamstring and implement restrictive barriers to Public Service Loan Forgiveness (PSLF)
- Reduce access and affordability of income-driven student loan repayment plans
- Cap or eliminate loans to attend graduate and professional schools
- Make it harder for victims of unscrupulous institutions to escape student loan debt

SCHOOL MEALS

- Funding for school meals could be cut by at least \$12 billon by limiting schools covered by the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) and requiring recipients of school meals to verify family income
- Result: millions of students go hungry and burdensome paperwork for school food service professionals
- Many students and education support professionals also participate in the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), which could be cut by \$30 billion or more

CHILDREN'S HEALTHCARE / MEDICAID

- Medicaid/CHIP likely to be cut in multiple ways—number eligible, breadth of coverage, etc.
- Cutting the federal share of funding, another option, shifts costs to states
- 38 million children covered by Medicaid and CHIP comprise 47.4 percent of total Medicaid and CHIP enrollment

IMMIGRATION

- Drive up fees for immigration services, possibly including naturalization
- Increase funding for the White House deportation machine, which could include immigration enforcement in public schools
- Militarize the border and end any possibility of asylum seekers, including unaccompanied minors, seeking safety in our country
